Dear Teachers:

The Lindsay Ann Burke Memorial Fund is pleased to announce its **2012 Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Poster Contest** for Rhode Island high school students. The due date for entries is April 4, 2012.

This year's theme "**Warning Signs of Dating Abuse**" focuses on one or more of the warning signs. Given the alarming teen dating violence statistics, it is essential to educate teens about healthy vs. unhealthy relationships. Education provides our teens with the essential knowledge and skills necessary to determine if their relationships are healthy or abusive, and to help themselves and others. Education is a key factor in decreasing the incidence of teen dating violence.

Generally, the month of February is designated as **National Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month**. We are sponsoring this poster contest as a means of raising awareness of teen dating violence during the month of February. The Grand Prize winner will receive \$500.00 and 2 Runners Up will receive \$250.00 each. The winning poster will also be made available to Rhode Island high schools. Winners will be notified in April and we would like to present the prizes to the winners at their district School Committee Meeting or such equivalent.

Please encourage your students to enter this poster contest and feel free to share this with your colleagues. **Be sure to tell students to read the rules carefully, especially in regards to the theme and spelling, so as not to be disqualified. Remind students we choose posters that can be clearly read from a distance, as they will be hung on a wall.
